

DIVINE LANGUAGE (cont. from last issue)

While some scholars accept the knowledge contained in the Vedas to have been divinely revealed, yet they hold the view that the language in which they were transmitted to posterity was that of the Rishis.

The fact remains that language and thoughts are inter-dependent, for there can be no thought without language and can be no language without thought. Language is the vehicle of thought. Even when we think without speaking, we think in words and sentences generally in the mother-tongue. In fact we think in names. Words are the fortress (stronghold) of thought. Thinking and speaking can be distinguished as internal and external. Unless thought be accompanied at each point of its evolution by a corresponding evolution in language, its further development will be arrested. Language and intellect cannot be separated.

Concluding that even the language, in which the Vedas were revealed, was also divinely revealed. Without language it is impossible to conceive philosophical, even, human consciousness. Similarly, every word and its meaning are also inseparable. Thus when the words cow and horse were transmitted by God, they were accompanied by the pictures of cow and horse. Many impartial philologists and linguists now unequivocally admit that Sanskrit is the mother (neither aunt, nor sister) of all the important languages of the world (For elaboration, see author's original Habitat of the Aryans). It (Vedic language) comprises of philosophy compared with which the lessons of Pythagoras are but of yesterday (in point of time as well as in point of speculation).

The Vedic language is known for the derivative interpretation of words. Even in modern (classical) Sanskrit a word is invariably explained as being made up of a root and a prefix or suffix which together yield the form as well as the irregular meaning assigned to a given word. Usage also does not deviate from this main principle, but it is still probable that it restricts a word to one of its many significations. In that case a particular word used in a passage will have to be translated according to the resolution then credible so that the particular restricted sense may be clearly expressed. Is it believable that the Vedic language, which is so perfect and is the mother of all the language of the world, is the result of any human effort? It is the Divine language? The most regular language known, especially remarkable as containing the roots of the various languages of the world. The large number of languages, which are said to have their origin-or bear close affinity—to Sanskrit, is truly astonishing and is another proof of the latter's high ancient times. At one time Sanskrit was the one language, spoken all over the world.

Our Lord has provided us with a Divine speech as a vehicle to communicate and receive ideas. While this speech is man's special privilege. But it is a very poor vehicle which has its own limitations. In a set language of limited vocabulary we have to express our thoughts of gross and abstract realms. Sugar is sweet in a bio-chemical sense, voice is sweet or music is sweet in another sense, one's face is sweet in another way; and our relations are sweet in some other connotations. Each and every sweetness has its own spectrum. But our vocabulary is poor, so that at times we fail to express our ideas or sentiments just as we would like to.
